On 1st June I attended site as link governor to review the implementation of the risk assessments in line with health and safety prior to re-opening for nursery, reception and years 1 and 6. Accompanied by Ms Jones, I toured the site and met with members of staff to review procedures and ensure that appropriate signage was in place to keep social distancing between year group bubbles. It was observed that preparation work carried out by the team has been first class and only very minor adjustments suggested to what was proven to be a very detailed risk assessment.
