### **Communication with parents**

- The Parents Association communicates with parents via several means;
  - Primarily through Whatsapp groups (all Reps are on a group with us who then share information with classes).

  - In addition, we use posters within school (often with children input/ creativity), PA Facebook page, and messages in book bags.

## 2022/2023

## **Bake sales 2022/23**

- Bake sale money raised in last academic year were ringfenced and each class teacher was given an allowance to spend on something to enrich their class experience.
   Ideas for class spend included workshops, outings, books, art and sports equipment.
- The same initiative will run this academic year giving classes back the money they raise from their sales.

# Uniform sale (s)

- Regular events run throughout the year selling second hand uniform....
- (And also, discretely supporting families who need donations)

## **Christmas gifts**

- Personalised Christmas gifts which parents can order online (mugs, tote bags etc) raised £526 profit for the school Christmas 2022.
- This is achieved with fantastic support from schoolteachers allowing children to design their Christmas template at school.
- Christmas tree sales (in partnership with a local supplier) also generated £170 profit.

### **Class tea towels**

As above – another template initiative in the run up to Christmas which made £1230 profit in 2022. And again, only possible with combined PA / teacher effort.

#### **Christmas Disco**

- First big event in school since the pandemic was a fantastic success with school discos for every year. Children paid to attend and could buy sweets, popcorn, tuck shop goodies and glow sticks.
- A great event for the school and community and raised £644 profit.

# Pancake Day

 Children and parents could join us for pancakes after school – all pre ordered and delicious toppings selected. Easy to organise event which was enjoyed by many and raised over £300.

### World Book Day – Big Book Swap

- School wide activity our generous community of parents donated over 1,000 books which were organised by author / type / age.
- On World Book Day all children could donate £1 (optional) to select a 'new' book to take home. Classes were taken to the big book swap throughout school hours and parents could any left over at the end of the day.
- Great community event which raised £300.

# Mother's Day / Father's Day / Someone Special gifts

- As per Christmas activity, personalised gifts ordered for Mother's Day and Father's Day. This has been sensitively managed, and parents could choose from two different versions (Mother's or Father's Day / Someone Special).
- Profit TBC on AGM.

# Family Bunny Bingo - 30th April

- Family bingo sessions running after school.
- Drinks, tuck, dabber pens and extra game books available.
- Special bunny bingo caller (teacher support).
- Profit TBC on AGM.

# **Bounce for SHADE** - 16<sup>th</sup> June

- A sponsored bounce for the children (and staff!) seeing how many bounces they can
  do in a minute for their house team. This has been incredibly popular before (raising
  £6,225 in 2022 for school library/ books).
- This year we will be raising for playground shade (ie.e sails to protect from the sun)
- Profit TBC on AGM.

# Summer Beach Party Fair – 1<sup>st</sup> July

- o An amazing Summer beach event which raised over £6000...
- This would not have been possible without reps getting stuck in, parents manning stands, and everyone donating gifts and time.
