Weekly **Parent Prayer Reminder!** Monday 27th February 9am, Small Meeting Room Parents' prayers for the Blue school community. We also take prayer requests. Everyone is welcome.

We always love exploring history in varied and creative ways in the Blue School and encourage the children to develop key skills as historians, such as making comparisons, asking questions and understanding that the interpretation of historical events often changes with time.

Year 6 have recently finished their Civil Rights topic, which has prompted amazing discussion about rights and equality. They focused specifically on the Civil Rights movement in 50's America and wrote evocative and powerful recounts, imagining they were a child watching Martin Luther King's 'I Have a Dream' speech at the Lincoln Memorial in 1963.

Year 5 are embarking upon the epic topic of Medieval Monarchs. They will be examining the significance of the Magna Carta and drafting their own charter. This topic extends right up to the reign of Elizabeth I; children will be looking at why this period in history was called The Golden Age.

In Year 4's Anglo Saxons topic, children have been learning about pagan religions and how Christianity was introduced by monks such as Columba, Augustine and Aidan. The children have been looking at how settlements were designed to support the hierarchy of communities and the Anglo-Saxon way of life, and examining artefacts




This week in worship the themes were Temptation Joel 2:1-2, 12-17 and God keeps his promises Genesis 9:8-17. On Monday, Mr Hammer spoke about temptation and the beginning of our lenten journey. The children were reminded about Shrove Tuesday and making a lenten promise.

On Wednesday Reverend Dave Maclure led worship and he spoke about lent and what the ash represents. He explained in many churches Christians added ash to their foreheads on Ash Wednesday. This was Rev Dave's last time leading a worship at our school. We thanked him for his support and dedication over the years. We wish him well as he moves to his new parish next term and look forward to celebrating the Year 6 Easter

service at his church at the end of term.

On Thursday, during in-class worship, children were reminded about the promises God made to Noah. Children shared many examples of their views on the promises they can make and we read many of these on worship on Friday.









to see what they can tell us about how Anglo-Saxons lived.

Year 3 will be starting their new history topic looking at The Shang Dynasty, which reigned in China from 1600-1046 BCE. The children will be studying how artefacts such as oracle bones, cowrie shells and pottery can tell us about this ancient and powerful civilisation.

Reception Giraffes and Kangaroos will be studying extinct animals over the next two weeks and making 'fossils' using clay and toy dinosaurs. They will be learning to look after a dinosaur egg and making prehistoric habitats. The theme will be threaded throughout the curriculum into English, maths and Science from counting to writing predictions.



Earlier in the month, Y1 children enjoyed their food workshop with Chef Ulisse. They discussed the Eatwell Plate and named a variety of fruit and vegetables - avocados and figs proving trickier to name! They then had fun sorting them according to whether they had seeds, roots, stems, flowers, leaves or pods.


